Meyer at Main Line

The highly competitive fifth annual Betsy Meyer Memorial Show at the Main Line Art Center is a vital showcase for up-and-coming regional artists and for those who keep track of their advancement.

Guest curator William Pym, formerly Fleisher/Ollman Gallery's director, chose a cool 43-piece show by 27 artists who survived the cut from 68.

Pym awarded the show's single prize (\$1,000) to Gerry Tuten of Villanova for *Summer Garden*, a painting based on closely observed scenery she loves, and on her intense response to the ever-changing beauty of the Main Line countryside. That piece suggests a perfect adjustment of man to nature. A utopian dream, yes, but one we wish to believe.

Also noteworthy are works by Madeline Adams, Alana Bograd, Arden Bendler Browning, Lydia Hamilton Brown, Karen Freedman, Eric Kennedy, Jong Kyu Kim, Penelope Tsaltas Lisk, Richard Weiner, Etta Winograd, Maya Camille Winters, Kimberly Witham and Drew Zimmerman. Come see.
