





Exhibition Featuring Artists with Disabilities Comes to Community Venues

Presented by Main Line Art Center at Ludington and Gladwyne Libraries, and Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped

May 17 – June 5, 2013 Opening Reception: Saturday, May 18, 1 - 3 at Ludington Library

HAVERFORD, PA (April 30, 2013)—Each year, Main Line Art Center presents an exhibition which showcases the vibrant and colorful work created by children and adults with cognitive, physical, and emotional disabilities in the Center's Outreach Programs. Boasting Outreach Programs that serve as national models, the Art Center is proud to be one of the leading visual arts organizations in the region to make art accessible to diverse groups in the community. This year, the Center will present the exhibition offsite in public venues as part of its new *Exhibitions in the Community* Program. *Outreach 2013: 5+1 Sense Ability and Awareness* will be presented at Ludington Library (Bryn Mawr), Gladwyne Library (Gladwyne), and Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped (Philadelphia) May 17 to June 5, and will be celebrated with an opening reception on Saturday, May 18 from 1 to 3 pm at Ludington Library.

This year's exhibition theme, 5+1: Sense Ability and Awareness, highlights the increased sense of awareness that becomes a positive strength for those with a disability. Students from the **Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired in Delaware County** created self-portrait busts from clay. Teens from

Presbyterian Children's Village created ceramic sculpture and glass plates. Children, teens, and young adults with cognitive disabilities from the Art Center's own program, **Exceptional Art**, as well as from **Elwyn Education Division Programs**, created colorful prints, ceramic bowls, and painted seasonal still-lifes from fresh produce. Each work of art provides an intimate view of how an individual perceives themselves and their relationship with world around them, reinforcing the power of art to communicate what often cannot be said in words.
