Suggested Materials to Bring:

Newsprint Paper for croquis drawings (gesture) Charcoal Paper (rough) and/or Drawing Paper (smooth) soft charcoal sticks (vine or willow) chamois kneaded eraser Graphite pencils Sharpener Clips to attach paper/pads to drawing boards Drawing Board (bring your own or use MLAC's.)

You can make do with buying very little new stuff in a drawing class, and in fact you may already have most of what you need. If folks are unsure just bring in what you've got and we can look through it and discuss.

This is essentially a drawing class, and the primary instructional vehicle will be drawing. However, students with more experience are welcome to work in any dry or water-based media of their choice such as watercolor, ink, pastel, collage etc. Exception: no oil paints or solvents please.
