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Multimedia Spectacle Planned for 2016 Panorama Festival at Main Line Art Center in Haverford

HAVERFORD, PA (October 4, 2016) — Digital and hands-on are set to collide on Saturday, October 22 from 5 to 9 pm at Main Line Art Center in Haverford for this year's *Panorama* Festival. From fire spinners, stilt walkers, food trucks, and multimedia live art performances outside, to interactive digital demos and stunning contemporary artwork inside, Main Line Art Center's signature event promises to be a delight for all of the senses.

The free Festival anchors the Art Center's second presentation of Panorama: Image-Based

Art in the 21st Century, which boasts 50+ events from September to November presented by the Art Center and its 40+ partners across Greater Philadelphia celebrating photography and digital media in contemporary art. *Panorama* 2016 is supported in part by an award from the National Endowment for the Arts.

The party won't be hard to miss! Firespinners and stilt walkers from 7textures will perform from 5:30-7:30 pm, and will put on a special presentation from 7 to 7:30 pm. Main Line Art Center's historical white house will become a canvas as 2016 Digital Artist in Residence Leo Hylan lights up the night with site-specific, interactive multimedia performances projected on the front and side of the building. Festival attendees can grab a bite from food trucks Chef Johnny Bravo's Surf n Turf and Short Order Mobile Cuisine as they groove to the sounds of DJ The Architech.

Once inside, Festival-goers can gather inspiration from *Panorama* feature exhibition *Enlightened Earth*. On view through November 5, *Enlightened Earth* explores nature and our complex relationship to its past, present, and future with works by <u>Julianna Foster</u> (Philadelphia, PA), <u>Nick Pedersen</u> (Burlington, NJ) and <u>Mark Dorf</u> (New York), who was recently included on Art Zealous' list of 30 *Under 30ish*. Their work leads us down a path of multi-layered, multi-media discovery through storytelling, scientific research, and fantastical landscapes.

The party doesn't stop at the gallery! Festival attendees can make their way from studio to studio to channel their own creativity through hands-on projects melding new technology with traditional mediums. Activities include image transfers onto wood to create coasters or ornaments, silkscreen prints and t-shirts (available for purchase), and collaborative stop-animation productions. In the Art Center's traditional black and white dark room, artist Matt Giel will present an installation featuring his photography from 6 to 8 pm.

During the Festival, and through November 5, artists of all ages are encouraged to create and upload digital photos, animation, or short videos for the *Panorama* virtual exhibition, *Earth Works*. Work can be made at one of the Art Center's Green Partners, gardens, arboretums, and green spaces in Greater Philadelphia, or at a location of their choosing. The exhibition will go live on mainlineart.org in January. Cash awards will be given to one adult artist and one youth artist selected as Best in Show.

Prior to the Festival on October 22 from 1 to 4 pm, Main Line Art Center is offering Portfolio Reviews with members of the Center's Artistic Advisory Board and internationally-exhibited artist Mark Dorf, featured in Enlightened Earth. Artists will gain valuable feedback on their work and make connections with experts in the field as they participate in one-on-one artwork reviews. Space is limited.
