

NEW TEACHER HIGHLIGHT



Morgan Craig is a painter based in Philadelphia who has exhibited his work widely throughout the US, Canada, Europe, and Australia. Much of Morgan's artwork focuses on structures of an industrial or institutional nature. He travels the world researching the built environment, and continues to create work dealing with how identity is influenced by the types of architectural edifices present in a given landscape. Morgan is the recipient of numerous awards including the Pollock Krasner Foundation Grant, the Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation Grant (2007, 2011), and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts Individual Artist Fellowship for 2006 and 2008. This session he will be teaching *What You Can't See: Explorations in Painting "Reality"* for adults.

Rachel Stine is an artist with a degree in Game Art and Production from Drexel University whose focus is on experimental, interactive art and small autobiographical stories. A vocal advocate for making the gaming industry more inclusive, Rachel has presented on this topic at Penn State University and Philadelphia Comic Con. Rachel began teaching game design classes to children and adults in 2014, and this session will be presenting World is Mine: Creating Extraordinary Worlds in Minecraft and Game Changer: Introduction to Game Design, both kids classes.





Born in El Paso, TX and now living in Philadelphia, sculptor Wes Valdez earned his BFA in Glass from Southern Illinois University Carbondale and his MFA in Glass from Tyler School of Art at Temple University. Wes' work is informed by personal narrative and explores themes of mortality, duality, loss, abandonment, ideals of perfection, and mechanisms of stress. He has received multiple awards including the distinguished 2011 Windgate Fellowship and the Rickert-Ziebold Trust Award, and his work has been featured in numerous publications including New Glass Review 32 and 33, published by the Corning Museum of Glass. Currently the glass studio supervisor at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia. Wes will bring his expertise to

the Art Center this session with his two classes, Explorations in Glass: Welcome to the Glass Lab and Cold Glass Construction and Mechanical Components.

ART STAR:

Although he's only 14 years old, Kyle M. is quite a Main Line Art Center veteran. Since 2012, Kyle has taken nearly 10 classes, first with his father or brother, and then eventually on his own. Over the years he dabbled in wheel-throwing and drawing and painting...then he found his real passion: metalworking. According to his mom Kathleen, this makes total sense. "He is very mechanically inclined," says Kathleen. "He will take anything and everything apart, either to see how it works or to use the parts in some other creation." He's taken many metal- and jewelry-working courses over the years to hone his skills, becoming so comfortable with his tools and materials that he is currently taking an adult metalworking class while still in high school!

Kyle is considering becoming a professional machinist because he loves to work with metals, wood, and large machines, something he does at home as well as at Main Line Art Center. His current project is a bushcraft knife made with walnut handles and bronze accents, which he had put hours into making. But he has interests in other arts as well, having taken 3 years of tap dancing! Artistic activities like dancing and metalworking are useful for channeling Kyle's boundless energy into something amazing.

After taking so many metalworking courses and getting comfortable with the teachers, Kyle decided to volunteer as a Teaching Artist Assistant during the summer of 2016. Main Line Art Center is grateful to be the first place he wanted to volunteer! He found he loved helping out with the classes and appreciated how the teachers respected him. "I'm always happy to be at Main Line Art Center," Kyle says. "The teachers are great and volunteering at camp was fun. I've had a lot of great experiences with my dad and brother."

"Kyle has been such a positive, creative, and engaging artist in our community," says Amie Potsic, Executive Director & Chief Curator of Main Line Art Center. "I feel very lucky to have a young person like Kyle serving as a leader in our community by setting a wonderful example of giving back, being creative, and following your dreams."
