# ART STAR:

## JESSICA CURTAZ

For nearly three years, Main Line Art Center has been lucky to have Jessica Curtaz as a teaching artist in our Accessible Art Programs for children and adults with disabilities. Bringing years of prior expertise, Jessica's experience in our programs began when she volunteered for the Creating in Clay program with the Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired in Chester. "I was really interested in how to teach a primarily visual media to a non-visual population," she said. Jessica now teaches several mixed media classes for children and teens with developmental disabilities at the Art Center along with a host of other programs around the Philadelphia area, including the Pennsylvania School for the Deaf, the Elwyn Davidson School, The Village, Center for Creative Works, and Art-Reach. Her dedication to teaching children, teens, and adults has made a huge impact on their lives, which she says teaches them "empowerment through learning usable skills and employing creativity."

As a graduate of the University of California at Santa Cruz and Claremont Graduate University, Jessica has a varied background in art. She studied plant biology, drawing, ceramics, and printmaking, but her personal artwork ended up going in a different direction: Jessica is a "yarn bomber," which means she covers public property with knit and crochet creations. Fiber arts isn't something she has been trained in, but she found that she is "a huge proponent of erasing boundaries between museum and gallery spaces and people's everyday experience." These informal installations allow her to interact with the public and a variety of people to experience art in their everyday lives.

Jessica loves working here because our Accessible Art classes "are about socialization within a community as well as creating a bridge to understand the greater community." That is what Main Line Art Center has in abundance.
