#### WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO HAVE AN 'ADVENTURE'?

It's almost the end of summer and our ever-growing Main Line Art Center Summer Art Camp. The theme for this year's summer camp was The Art of Exploring: Nature, Myth & Magic, and that theme has had me thinking about what it means to explore and to really have an adventure. Some of the weekly themes we came up with for this summer-long adventure focus were Enchanted Forest: Where Hobbits, Gnomes, Fairies & Nymphs Dwell, Science Fiction Landscapes: Art in Outer Space and Ancient Worlds: From Babylon to the Pyramids of Egypt.

But the real adventure wasn't confined to any of those weekly themes; it took place every time a camper tried to do something they had previously assumed they couldn't do, every time they started something whose outcome they couldn't predict. This adventure wasn't confined to our camp, either.

Our adult classes continued this summer as well, taking place during the day at the Haverford School and in the evening at Main Line Art Center, and they included long-loved classes like Francine Shore's A Painting Seminar and brand-new offerings like First Cut: Woodworking 101, and in every single class, there were moments of adventure for every single student. Those were the "aha!" moments, the "oh my gosh!" moments, the "Oh, no, I ruined it! Hey, wait, that actually looks good!" moments and the "I never thought I'd be doing this" moments.

Art making and art classes are full of those moments and as you read through some of the stories of creative growth in this issue of The Circle of Art and hear about some of our offerings for this fall, I hope you'll be inspired to take on an adventure of your own. We'll be here to cheer you on.

# LEARNING FROM THE TREE OF LIFE: WOODWORKING

# DAN HALPRIN INTERVIEWS TEACHING ARTIST ROB WISNIEWSKI

This summer, Main Line Art Center had its first woodworking class titled First Cut:Woodworking 101 and taught by Rob Wisniewski at the Haverford School. It was a wonderful opportunity for our students to expand their range of mediums and for us to expand our collaboration with a valued neighbor. I discussed the power and meaning of woodworking with Rob, and here are some excerpts from our talk.

# Can you tell me a little bit about this idea of the sapling inside the tree?

Sure, I think alot of people don't stop to think about that. You have the sapling or you have the tree, but everything the sapling is going to become is inside the tree, that's how you have those knots.

When I teach, I start with "where does wood come from?" and then I start talking about grains, and then techniques and then the creative process.

I'm curious, having worked with lots of different tools, is there any tool that especially resonates with you as the one that gets you closest to feeling that spiritual connection to the wood when you're using it?

Everyone's different, but I have a bias towards hand tools. For millenia, people have worked with hand tools before the industrial age came along and they've created some of the most incredible furniture to this day. It hasn't been surpassed and it was created before there was even electricity.

So there's this huge lost art of what happened with chisels, but thankfully in the last 58 years, the Henry Mercer Museum and Eric Sloan and others have found the romance in this lost art, and they've collected a body of work that helps you to understand how this was done and tap into the spirit of this lost art, and when you do, there's tremendous craftsmanship.

#### I know that the main focus of this course is making a mallet. I'm curious what inspired you to pick that focus.

We wanted something that students could make and then use right away. We wanted it to be, "we take wood and we make stuff out of it," hammer, nail. It's kind of universal.

#### It's also kind of primal.

Yeah, woodworking is primal.

I think one of the really interesting things about woodworking and a lot of art making is that you have this really contemporary technology and also this really ancient technology, so it's kind of like you get to do time-travel in two directions, go into the future and then way into the past.

Yes, and what I've found is, it's cyclical. I'll always start out with hand-tools, how to measure and cut, and it's partially for safety reasons but it's also so they have the basic skills, and then from there you start to ease into power tools. And there's this huge excitement when they move to the power tools, but really what you're doing is you're just a machine operator, so then then after a couple years, you want to do something finer, something hand carved, but then you need some hands skills.

#### It sounds like a pilgrimage.

It is, it's a journey. It depends how long you want to stay on it, but if you stay on it long enough, you get there.




