

Fall 2025 TEACHING ARTIST APPRENTICESHIP APPLICATION

Position Description

Teaching Artist Apprentices (TAAs) work with experienced, professional teaching artists to guide students as they make art. This opportunity is for individuals who are passionate about art education, enjoy working with children, and want to gain working knowledge about how to teach art in an informal educational setting. TAAs will build confidence working with children of various ages, gain experience with classroom management, and practice effective communication for lesson delivery.

TAAs receive \$15.00/hour for time spent in the studio, plus a half hour of prep. TAAs must commit to supporting at least one class, which runs once per week during the Fall 2025 semester. A class must have a minimum of 5 students enrolled to allow for a TAA. Your position will be confirmed one week prior to the class's start date.

Responsibilities

- TAAs must feel comfortable working with children and upholding basic rules and policies to maintain a safe, clean, and organized environment
- Help teaching artists prepare materials and studios before classes
- Assist children with artmaking, supporting positive and confident experiences
- Escort children to restrooms so the teaching artist can remain in the studio

Position Requirements

- 15 years of age or older. TAAs under age 18 must provide a work permit.
- Commitment to support at least one class for the full duration of the fall semester
- Completed W-9 and Child Abuse clearance

Physical Requirements & Working Conditions

Must be able to remain in a standing or stationary position for extended periods of time. Must be able to adapt to fast-paced environments, occasionally moving/lifting lightweight equipment and other work-related objects up to 25lbs. Must be able to interact with diverse groups of children, adults, and families.
